Dear Landowners,

January 28, 2021

As the owner of a farm which is being offered for preservation or as an owner of a preserved farm with a change in the agricultural operation or operator, you need to be aware that a current Conservation Plan or Ag E&S Plan is required by State law, and by the agricultural conservation easement program, to cover any area of agricultural production on your farm. The attached documents provide you with the necessary forms to fill out, as well as other information about conservation planning and how to find assistance with implementing conservation practices.

A **Conservation Plan** is a record of decisions for the landowner and farmer to aid in successfully addressing any resource concerns on the farm, as defined by USDA-NRCS planning standards. These plans are written to meet the PA Clean Streams Law, and generally address all land uses on the farm. An **Ag Erosion & Sedimentation Plan (Ag E&S Plan)** is a plan written based on standards stated in the PA Clean Streams Law, Chapter 102, to address any tillage or soil disturbance caused by the farming operation, to include actively farmed crop fields, animal heavy use areas, and areas of pasture which have limited grass cover. For applicants to the easement program, the plan must be at least 50% implemented for the application to be considered qualifying. A farm application may be deemed not qualifying if there are significant conservation concerns. See attached the "**Complying with Ag E&S and Manure Management Plans**" sheet, developed by the York County Conservation District, to highlight the key requirements for Ag E&S Plans along with Manure Management Plan information.

A **Manure Management Plan (MMP)** is required for any farm where manure is generated by livestock (from one animal and up), or where manure is spread on any crop fields or pastures, or deposited on pastures. A **MMP Guidebook** can be provided by the Conservation District Office or found on the PA Department of Environmental Protection website, [www.dep.pa.gov](http://www.dep.pa.gov). – See enclosed cover page of this Guidebook. If your farm is deemed a Concentrated Animal Operation (CAO), or a Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation (CAFO), you will need an approved **Act 38 Nutrient Management Plan**, written by a certified planner. Our agency does encourage conservation stewardship with woodland management on your farm. You may contact Matt Kern, Service Forester at 717-630-1770, for woodland management advice, and information on how to find assistance for a **Woodland Management Plan**. If you are planning a timber harvest or clearing and grubbing in the near future, State law requires that your logger have a **Timber Harvest E&S Plan** or **Clearing and Grubbing E&S Plan** on site. You can obtain a Timber Harvest Packet and E&S planning documents from the Conservation District- See the Timber Harvest E&S Plan cover page attached. Call the District at 717-840-7430.



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Please review the attached forms and information. If you are not already a Cooperator with the Conservation District, please fill out the attached **Cooperator Form** and send it to the District at their new address. If you have conservation plans that would be on file with the USDA-NRCS office, please fill out the attached **Authorization for Release of Records Form**, listing our agency as one they may release your plan to, and initial the appropriate box, so we can receive your conservation plan and related documents.

If you need an updated or new conservation plan, we have enclosed an **Ag Education and Outreach Fact Sheet**, naming District staff and how they can assist you, and a **Private Conservation Planner Contacts** sheet, showing business cards of local private planners. This is not an endorsement of any planner, but just the cards of those we are aware of that can assist you. You can also reference the overall list of planners available on the **Private-Public Planners Spreadsheet** for information on how to get assistance.

Finally, we know that being a good conservation steward of the land takes planning and hard work, but also extra funds and support. We have enclosed the latest **Conservation Funding Programs** sheet to give you program information and the contact information for those who administer funds and programs to assist you with conservation stewardship on your farm. As you seek to preserve your farm, or are working to install or maintain best management practices, we are available to answer questions or direct you to those who can help you to be successful in your efforts. ## Complying with Ag E&S and Manure Management Plans

### Ag Erosion and Sediment (Ag E&S) Plans

- 1) Required in PA on all cropland, hayland and Animal Concentration Areas over 5,000 total square feet. Includes No-till operations. Must address gully and sheet and rill erosion.
- 2) Similar to a conservation plan in that must include maps (plan, soils and topo), plan narrative of needed practices and timeline of implementation status, soil description and supporting soil loss calculations.
- 3) NRCS conservation plan may satisfy an Ag E&S plan but Ag E&S will not meet Conservation Plan standards for USDA-NRCS.
- 4) Plan must be current and accurate, reflecting what is being done and who the responsible parties are (landowner and/or operator). Must be implemented to be in compliance.
- 5) Can be developed by Conservation District, private consultants and partially by a farmer (PA One Stop) but not as simple as doing a manure management plan.
- 6) Plan must be kept on file and records maintained by the operator but is not required to be submitted unless by compliance inspection.
- 7) A copy of the Ag E&S manual is available on the DEP website. Search for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Manual for Agricultural Operations.

### Manure Management Plan

- 1) Required by every farm/livestock operation that land applies manure, has animals that generate manure, or has animals on pasture.
- 2) Manure Management Workbook is available online or hard copies are available from the Conservation District.
- 3) The state requires that this workbook be used for the planning format. Records can be kept in your own format or on the sheets provided.
- 4) Plan can be developed by you or a private consultant. The Conservation District does not currently write Manure Management Plans.
- 5) Plan must be current and accurate, reflecting what is being done and who the responsible parties are (landowner and/or operator). Must be implemented to be in compliance.
- 6) Plan must be kept on file and records maintained by the operator but is not required to be submitted unless by way of compliance inspection.
- 7) Nutrient Balance Sheets with maps may suffice if importing manure from a nutrient management operation.

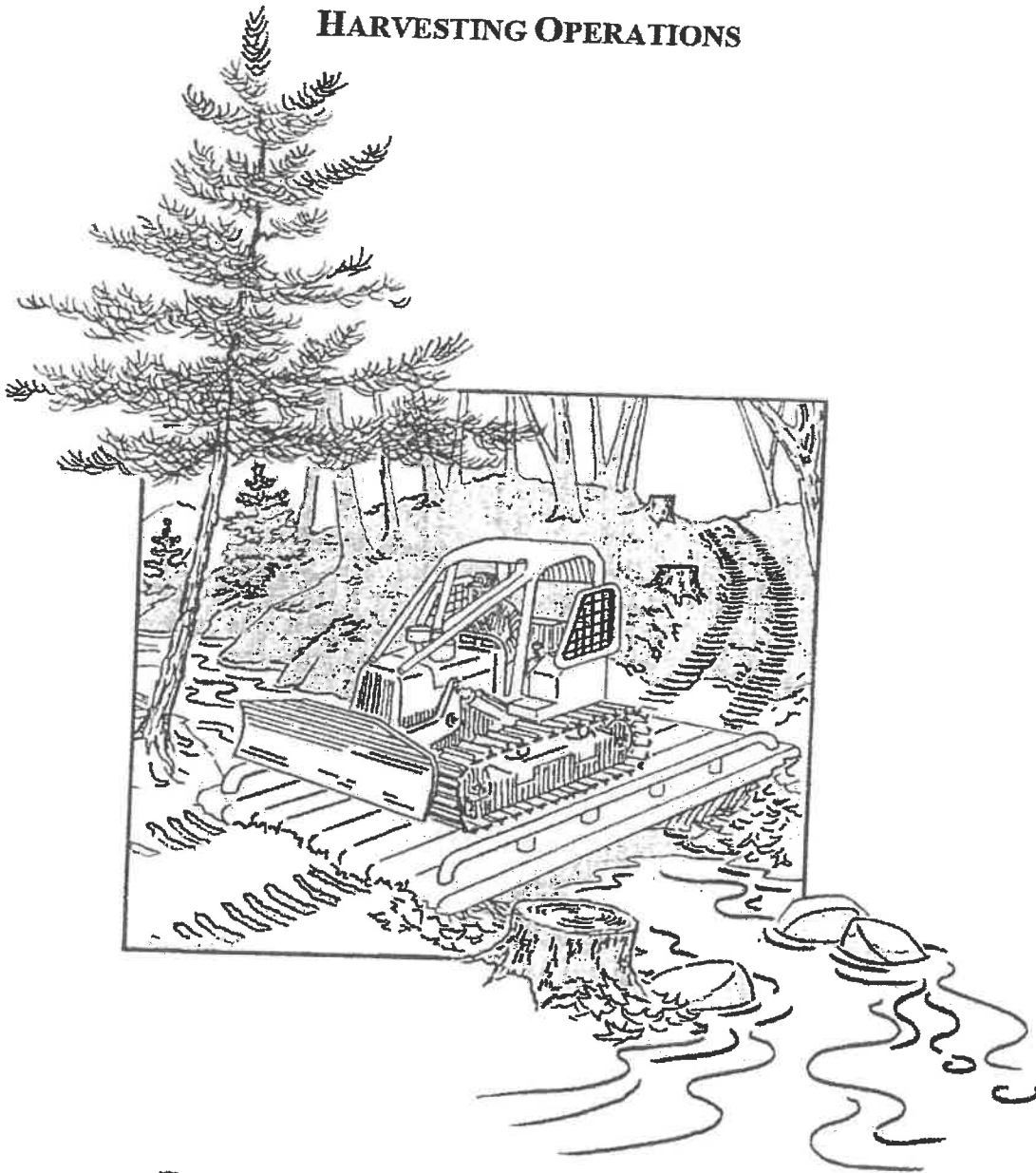
