

Question #1	<p>How many residential housing beds are required? There are no specific number of housing beds required, however, consideration should be given on the potential number needed to sustain the project.</p>
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Question # 2	<p>Will funding be fee for service or grant type or other form? York/Adams HealthChoices Management Unit will be seeking approval from OMHSAS to be able to offer funds toward the development of the project. Potential fee for service funding can also be generated through the Certified Recovery Specialist and Buprenorphine Coordination if provided and if insurance commits to covering the service. These are both services the County is currently willing to cover through the program while they are the primary contractor of the HealthChoices Program. Residents of the Recovery House will be an additional source of revenue for the project.</p>
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Question #3	<p>What is time frame from acceptance of RFP to “opening doors of program”? There are always numerous factors that come into play when developing a project of this nature. However, we would like to see the project operating by 2020.</p>
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Question #1	<p>Would startup costs cover the need to purchase, renovate or build the facility? Specific Number of beds required? 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Question #3	<p>Will the provider manage and prioritize referrals? Will designated referral sources be established by the funder, i.e., limited to probation, YADAC/MH-IDD, etc. or can referrals also come from other substance abuse treatment providers? The provider will manage and prioritize referrals for the Recovery House with input from the York/Adams HealthChoices Management Unit’s Housing Support Specialist. Potential Recovery House residents must have support from probation or a treatment provider when an application is submitted. Most of the people being served must be on Medical Assistance.</p>
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
