Wallace-Cross Mill, constructed in 1826, was operated continuously until the 1980s. The mill was placed on the Pennsylvania Inventory of Historic Places in February 1977 and on the National Register of Historic Places in June 1977. In 1979, the owner, Harry E. Cross, gave the mill to the people of York County.

Restoration of the first floor was completed in 1999 and the second and third floors in 2006.

Wallace-Cross Mill is a rare example of a small country water-powered grain mill with an overshot water wheel. The mill, tucked away in its unspoiled little valley, was bypassed by modernization and the elements survive today.



Ownership of the mill changed only four times, with one name change from the family name of Wallace to Cross. The restoration focus is the 1950 era: during the peak of Harry Cross' career.

This museum includes three floors with various interpretative displays, historic artifacts, and operating water-powered, supplied by Rambo Run, milling equipment. The exhibits appeal to all ages.

DIRECTIONS TO MILL:

From Stewartstown:

Take Main Street (Rt. 24) north, turn right on Hickory Rd., then left onto Cross Mill Rd, Follow to Mill on right.

From Red Lion: Follow Rt. 24 south to Church Rd. Turn left, following Church Rd. to right on Cross Mill Rd. Bear left at top of hill. Follow to Mill on left.
