

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NEW ONLINE COURSE FROM SAMHSA'S CAPT

Opioid Overdose Prevention: Understanding the Basics

In 2017, the problem of opioid overdose was declared a public health emergency in the United States. This new online course from SAMHSA's Center for the Application of Prevention Technologies is designed to help prevention practitioners understand and address this urgent problem. Through engaging activities, reflections, and videotaped interviews with prevention leaders, this course introduces the range of factors associated with opioid overdose and promising strategies to address it.

Monday, May 7 – Friday, May 18, 2018

What does participation entail?

You may take the course at any point during the dates listed above. The course will take approximately five hours to complete, though timing will vary depending on your learning style and familiarity with the content.

SAMHSA's Center for the Application of Prevention Technologies (CAPT) is piloting a new self-paced, online course. The course, "Opioid Overdose Prevention: Understanding the Basics" is designed to help prevention practitioners understand and address the problem of opioid overdose.

The attached flyer has details on how to register, the course dates (May 7 -18), and information on certification credits. The registration deadline is May 3rd.

Course Content

Module 1: Overview of the Problem and Role of Prevention explores the scope of the opioid overdose crisis in the U.S., different types of opioids involved, related trends, and the need to prevent overdoses from occurring as well as death and disability when they do occur.

Module 2: Factors Associated with Opioid Overdose explores six categories of factors associated with increased risk of unintentional opioid overdose: (1) Opioid Use and Misuse, (2) Physiological Changes, (3) Chronic Pain and Mental Health, (4) Opioid Access and Supply, (5) Overdose Knowledge and Perceptions, and (6) Treatment and Recovery Support Services.

Module 3: Strategies to Reduce Opioid Overdose Risk explores six strategies that have shown promise in reducing people's risk of opioid overdose: (1) Education, (2) Prescription Drug Disposal Programs, (3) Prescription Drug Monitoring Programs, (4) Prescribing and Dispensing Regulations, (5) Law Enforcement Actions, and (6) Treatment and Recovery Support Services.

Module 4: Strategies to Prevent Overdose Death and Disability explores two strategies that have shown promise in reducing death and disability in the event of an opioid overdose: (1) Naloxone Access and Promotion and (2) 911 Good Samaritan Protections.

Module 5: The Value of a Comprehensive Approach explores what a comprehensive approach to opioid overdose prevention looks like and key benefits communities can experience by taking this type of approach.
