

YORK/ADAMS DRUG & ALCOHOL COMMISSION

MAXIMUM BENEFITS FORM

Since the York/Adams Drug and Alcohol Commission (YADAC) has limited treatment funding to provide services for many individuals, the following rules will apply as a "maximum benefits package". The goal is to be fair to those individuals who do not have a way to pay for treatment and therefore rely on YADAC for assistance. YADAC is not responsible, nor are legally obligated, to pay for drug and alcohol services once the funding from the state is used.

Given that YADAC is the payer of last resort, it is the responsibility of the individual and provider to utilize every available funding avenue; such as medical assistance, grant money, private insurance, EAP, Veterans benefits, etc. before accessing YADAC funding.

LEVEL OF CARE ASSESSMENT/OUTPATIENT (Intensive Outpatient, Outpatient, and Partial Hospitalization)

- A. YADAC does not restrict the number of level of care assessments or outpatient (Intensive Outpatient, Outpatient, and Partial Hospitalization) episodes an individual may access.
- B. Individuals must be a York or Adams County resident; however, there is no length of time an individual must have been a resident to be eligible for funding for these services.

DETOX

- A. Individuals are not limited to the number of detox placements that they may be admitted into during a fiscal year (July 1 to June 30). If more than one detox occurs during the fiscal year, YADAC may require follow-up with the individual to review the individual's plan for treatment before subsequent detox episodes are authorized.
- B. All detox admissions must be processed through White Deer Run National Resource Center (NRC). This will allow the NRC to document and report the number of detox admissions that occur in a fiscal year for reporting purposes.
- C. Individuals must be a York or Adams County resident; however, there is no length of time an individual must have been a resident to be eligible for funding for this level of care.

RESIDENTIAL REHAB AND HALFWAY HOUSE

- A. An individual must have been a resident in York or Adams County for at least six (6) months in order to be eligible for funding to a rehab or halfway house.
- B. There is a maximum of one admission per fiscal year (July 1 to June 30), per individual. Any length of stay is considered an admission.
- C. If an individual has warrants and/or detainees YADAC funding may be denied.

GENERAL RULES

- A. If an individual is pregnant and have a substance use disorder, the above rules will be waived and services may be expedited.
- B. The liability amount may vary, depending on the family income and number of the dependents.
- C. The provider will make every effort to assist individuals in applying for and being approved for Medical Assistance funding.
- D. Individuals must immediately apply for Medical Assistance and provide documentation of eligibility. Failure to immediately apply or provide documentation of eligibility may make an individual ineligible for YADAC funding.
- E. Proof of residency and/or U.S. citizenship may be required.
- F. If there are any questions about these rules, please discuss them with the person who conducted the level of care assessment.
