The February 21, 2018 York County Board of Commissioners Meeting was held at the York County Administrative Center, 28 E. Market Street York, PA 17401.

**1. CALL TO ORDER**

President Commissioner Susan Byrnes called the meeting to order at 10 a.m, with Vice President Commissioner Doug Hoke, Commissioner Christopher Reilly, Administrator Mark Derr, Solicitor Glenn Smith, Controller Greg Bower, Treasurer Barb Bair, Administrative Assistant Darnell Ort and Commissioners Liaison Officer Rebecca Laird present.

**A. Opening Ceremony**

Veteran Patrick Rambeau led the Pledge of Allegiance.

## **5. PURCHASES**

### **A. Sage Technology Solutions**

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a purchase and services agreement between the County of York, on behalf of the York County Information Services Department, and Sage Technology Solutions, Mount Joy, PA for replacement to the Judicial Center Jury Assembly audio visual equipment for a total cost of \$48,613.08.

### **B. HON Company**

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to ratify a purchase between the County of York, on behalf of the Facilities Management Department and HON Company, Muscatine, Iowa, for the furniture for the renovated space in the 4<sup>th</sup> floor of the Judicial Center for use by the Public Defender's Office and the Court Interpreters at a cost not to exceed \$10,755.94.

## **6. AGREEMENTS**

### **A. County Bridge No. 114**

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a concurrence with the amendment to the Reimbursement Agreement (No. 08A066) and authorize signature of the President Commissioner for the Replacement of County Bridge No. 114, Valley Street over the Cordorus Creek in Glen Rock Borough, increasing the agreement amount by \$670,000 to additional construction costs, inspection, and construction consultation. Funded through the Transportation Improvement Plan with 80% Federal, 15% State, and 5% State Act 26 Funds.

**B. County Bridge No. 226**

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve concurrence with the amendment to Reimbursement Agreement (No. 08A170) and authorize signatures of the President Commissioner for the Rehabilitation of County Bridge No. 226, Hull Drive over the Bermudian Creek in Washington Township, increasing the agreement amount by \$675,000 to cover additional Final Design, Right-of-Way, and Construction costs. This project has been funded through the Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) with 80% Federal, 15% State, and 5% State Act 26 Funds.

**C. Barley Farms, LP, Chanceford Township**

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to acknowledge an agreement for the Sale and Purchase of an Agricultural Conservation Easement by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for a 213.56 acre crop farm owned by Barley Farms, LP, Chanceford Township, York County, and will utilize remaining 2017 Commonwealth of PA ag conservation easement funds totaling \$666,947.88.

**D. CPS Counseling Services**

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve the Letter of Agreement between the County of York, on behalf of Adult Probation Department and the provider, CPS Counseling Services of York County DUI Offenders, commencing on February 22, 2018 and terminating June 30, 2018.

**E. District Attorney's Institute**

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to approve an agreement between the County of York and the Pennsylvania District Attorney's Institute to maintain a statewide automated victim information and notification system referred to as SAVIN effective for the period January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018 at no cost to the county for 2018.

**7. CONTRACTS**

**A. Stenograph, Elmhurst, IL**

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a contract between the County of York, on behalf of the Courts, and Stenograph, Elmhurst, IL, for twenty (20) support Case Catalyst at a cost of \$550 per e-key, twenty (20) CV net licenses, at a cost of \$175 per license, and nineteen (19) Diamante Support Contracts, Basic/ Loaner at a cost of \$325 per contracted device, for a total cost of \$20,675.00 for the period of March 24, 2018 through March 23, 2019.

**B. Engie, North America, Houston, Texas**

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to ratify a contract between the County of York, on behalf of the Facilities Management Department and Engie, North America, Houston, Texas, to amend the master agreement dated November 30, 2015 to include tree (3) accounts that were not included in the original bid, with no other changes to the contract.

**C. Charles Hobbs, Esq**

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to approve the contract between the County of York and Charles Hobbs, Esq, in the amount of \$49,000.00 (forty nine thousand dollars) annually payable in the amount of \$4,083.33 ( Four thousand eighty-three dollars, and thirty three cents) each month for a caseload of 150 cases per year, for the criminal and juvenile delinquency cases involving defendants who cannot be represented by the Public Defender's Office, due to a conflict of interest.

**8. PROPOSALS**

**A. PANRC and PAC Industries Inc**

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to approve a proposal between the County of York, on behalf of PANRC and PAC Industries Inc. for the purchase of a Milner 60 lb. capacity washer/extractor, at a cost of \$11,951.00 for the facility's laundry system.

**9. RESOLUTIONS**

**A. Resolution 2018-11**

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to approve and execute an amended Resolution 2018-11 and approval document authorizing the issuance by the General Authority of Southern Pennsylvania of up to \$45,000,000 of tax- exempt financing to York Academy Foundation for (1) the acquisition, renovation and equipping of an elementary school building; (2) the acquisition of certain property, the demolition of existing structures and the construction and equipping of a new high school building on such property; (3) the payment of capitalized interest on the Bonds; (4) the funding of debt services reserve funds for the bonds; and (5) the payment of the cost issuing the bonds.

## **10. SOLICITATION OF BIDS**

### **A. Dairy Products**

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to authorize the Purchasing Department to Solicit bids for the “Dairy Products” for the York County Prison and Pleasant Acres Nursing and Rehabilitation Center for the period of May 1, 2018, through April 30, 2019.

### **B. Baked Goods**

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to authorize the Purchasing Department to solicit bids for “Baked Goods” for the York County Prison and Pleasant Acres Nursing and Rehabilitation Center for the period of May 1, 2018 through April 30, 2019.

### **C. Hollow Creek Greenway Trail**

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to authorize solicitation of bids for the construction of the Hollow Creek Greenway Trail through Nixon County Park, funded in part by PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources grants.

## **11. NOTICE TO PROCEED**

### **A. County Bridge No. 114**

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to authorize the Notice to Proceed to C.S Davidson, Inc for Construction Phase Services for the replacement of County Bridge No. 114, Valley Street, over the Cordorus Creek in Glen Rock Borough. The effective date of the notice to proceed will be February 7, 2018.

## **12. REIMBURSEMENT**

### **A. Attorney fees**

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to accept the Reimbursement for attorney fees submitted by April Thomas in the amount of \$994.50 for professional legal services retained for the right of way and temporary construction easement negotiations for the rehabilitation of County Bridge No. 226, Hull Drive over the Bermudian Creek Washington Township, and authorize signatures of the President Commissioner.

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to approve the Tax Refund Register 2018-04 authorizing payment of York County real estate refunds totaling \$58.86.
