

**COMMISSIONERS' MEETING
MINUTES**

12/18/19

The December 18, 2019 York County Board of Commissioners Meeting was held at the York County Administrative Building 28. E Market Street York PA 17401.

1. CALL TO ORDER

President Commissioner Susan Byrnes called the meeting to order at 10:06 a.m., Vice President Commissioner Doug Hoke, Commissioner Christopher Reilly, Controller Greg Bower, Treasurer Barbara Bair, Administrator/Chief Clerk Mark Derr, Solicitor Michelle Pokrifka, Commissioners Liaison Rebecca Laird and Administrative Assistant Darnell Musser present.

A. Opening Ceremony

Veterans Don Bradley and Terry Gendron Director of Facilities, led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Sharon Gardner, Baha'I faith led the invocation.

B. Presentation

The Commissioners' presented a check of \$15,000.00 for the Pleasant Acres Nursing and Rehabilitation Auxiliary Fund.

D. York County Redevelopment Authority

4. CONTRACTS

A. County Commissioners Association of Pennsylvania, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a contract agreement between the County of York, on behalf of the Adult Probation Department, and County Commissioners Association of Pennsylvania, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, to provide event notifications using the Unified Case Management System as a platform. Costs will be covered partially by the Records Improvement Fund and partially through the Probation Web Portal fees, for a total cost of \$18,000.00.

B. York County Weatherization Program

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a contract on behalf of the York County Weatherization Program with the Energy Doctor, to provide Quality Control Inspection Services on an as needed basis for the York County Weatherization Program at a rate of 10% of the total job cost or \$400.00 whichever is greater, with a trip charge of \$70.00 per inspection, for a period of one (1) year effective January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020.

C. York County Homebuyer Assistance Program

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a contract extension to the original contract between the County of York and Lancaster Housing Opportunity Partnership's and York Housing Opportunity Center, to provide administration and delivery services for the York County Homebuyer Assistance Program, for an additional six (6) month period beginning January 1, 2020 ending June 30, 2020.

D. Lead Based Paint Hazard Control and Healthy Homes Grant Program

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve an execution of a second extension to a contract agreement between the County of York, on behalf of the Housing Division, York County Planning Commission and the York City Bureau of Health, to provide the administration and delivery of the Lead Based Paint Hazard Control and Healthy Homes Grant Program, as outlined in the original contract agreement, dated July 1, 2017. The extension agreement is for an additional 7 months, effective beginning December 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020.

E. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), Washington, D.C

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a contract extension between the County of York, on behalf of the York County Prison, and Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), Washington, D.C., extending the contract agreement to December 31, 2024, with all other terms and conditions remaining the same. The contract extension allows for the continued negotiation of a new Intergovernmental Service Agreement under the 2019 Performance Based National Detention Standards.

F. Moetivations, Inc., Littleton, Colorado

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a contract with Moetivations, Inc., Littleton, Colorado, to provide call reviews and quality assurance scoring and quality improvement recommendations for the emergency medical protocol, for the 911 Quality Assurance and Quality Improvement Department. Such QA reviews will be in compliance with PEMA requirements. The contract term is one year and the cost is \$4,154.00 per month, for a maximum annual cost of \$49,848.00.

G. SAGE Technology Solutions, Mount Joy, Pennsylvania

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a contract agreement between the County of York, on behalf of the Information and Technology Services Department, and SAGE Technology Solutions, Mount Joy, Pennsylvania, to provide video services for Commissioners meetings, for a total cost of \$5,110.00, for the period of January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020.

H. Midwest Employers Casualty Company, Chesterfield, Missouri

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a contract agreement between the County of York, on behalf of the Human Resources Department, and Midwest Employers Casualty Company, Chesterfield, Missouri, to provide Excess Workers' Compensation insurance coverage, for a total cost of \$113,718.00, for the period of January 1, 2020 to January 1, 2021.

I. Murray Insurance Associates, Lancaster, Pennsylvania

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a contract agreement between the County of York, on behalf of the Human Resources Department, and Murray Insurance Associates, Lancaster, Pennsylvania, to provide Workers Compensation, Self-Insurance Claims, Administration and Risk Management services, for a total cost of \$55,000.00, for the period of January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020.

J. Attorney Jeffrey Marshall, York, Pennsylvania

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a contract agreement between the County of York, on behalf of the Domestic Relations Department, and Attorney Jeffrey Marshall, York, Pennsylvania, to provide required legal representation for Title IV-D cases as indicated in the Cooperative Agreement, for a total cost of \$85.00 per hour, for the period of January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020.

K. York County Bridge 105

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a contract change order No. 2 for the 2018 York County Adjacent Box Beam Bridge Maintenance Program with CriLon Corporation in the amount of \$2,643.90 for repairs to the southeast wingwall at York County Bridge 105. (Stewartstown Road over Deer Creek, Shrewsbury and Hopewell Townships). This increases the total contract price from \$998,814.76 to \$1,001,458.66. Payment is from the Liquid Fuels Account.

L. Schaad Detective Agency, Inc., York Pennsylvania

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve a contract agreement between the County of York, on behalf of the Facilities Management Department, and Schaad Detective Agency, Inc., York Pennsylvania, to provide uniformed guard services for the Pleasant Valley Road Building, Human Services Building and the Judicial Center, for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020. Rates are as shown.

5. AGREEMENTS

A. South Eastern School District

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve an agreement between the County of York, on behalf of the York County Treasurer's Office and South Eastern School District, to fulfill the duties of Fawn Grove Borough Tax Collector for the collection of 2020 and 2021 Real Estate Taxes effective January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2021 and authorize the Treasurer to sign all documents related to the agreement.

B. Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to approve an agreement between the County of York, on behalf of the York County Treasurer's Office and the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission to appoint the York County Treasurer as an issuing agent to sell fishing licenses and permits for a period of five (5) years with the agreement continuing annually thereafter until termination and authorize Treasurer to sign all documents related to the agreement.

C. Lobar Associates, Dillsburg, Pennsylvania

Commissioner Hoke made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Reilly and unanimously carried to ratify a supplemental agreement to a KPN contract approved June 19, 2019, between the County of York, on behalf of the Facilities Management Department, and Lobar Associates, Dillsburg, Pennsylvania, for an additional split system sealing of ductwork, acoustical ceiling work and sprinkler system modifications at the Pleasant Valley Road facility in the amount of \$47,925.08 under a KPN contract.

6. PURCHASES

7. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

A. PSSU SEI Local 668, AFL-CIO Probation & Parole and Domestic Relations Unit, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to approve a memorandum of understanding between the County of York, on behalf of the Human Resources Department, and PSSU SEI Local 668, AFL-CIO Probation & Parole and Domestic Relations Unit, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2023.

B. HealthChoices Reinvestment Fund

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to approve a memorandum of understanding between the County of York, and the Children's Advocacy Center Board of Directors to provide funding up to \$1,500,000.00 from the HealthChoices Reinvestment Fund allocated for the purchase and renovation of a co-located space, pending the compliance by all parties to the terms of the memorandum of understanding.

8. AUTHORIZE

A. Hollow Creek Greenway Trail

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to authorize the Parks and Recreation Department, to solicit bids for the construction of the Hollow Creek Greenway Trail through Nixon Park, funded in part by a PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Grant.

9. BID AWARD

A. Metro Flags, Inc., Wharton, New Jersey

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to approve a bid award between the County of York, on behalf of the Department of Veterans Affairs, and Metro Flags, Inc., Wharton, New Jersey, the lowest responsible bidder, for the purchase of 34,560 flags for veteran's graves on Memorial Day 2020, in the total amount of \$20,044.80.

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to approve the release of funds in the amount of \$23,000.00 to Farm & Natural Lands Trust of York County, for acquisition of a conservation easement of 64.69 +/- acres in North Codorus Township owned by Douglas L. & Sherry L. Stambaugh.

B. KHT Real Estate LP

Commissioner Reilly made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hoke and unanimously carried to approve the release of funds in the amount of \$9,000.00 to Farm & Natural Lands Trust of York County to cover settlement expenses in the acquisition of a donated conservation easement of 383.27 +/- acres in Manheim and West Manheim Townships owned by KHT Real Estate LP.

C. Sheppard et al Trust
