ORDINANCE 2011-04

**AN ORDINANCE DEALING WITH THIS DISPOSITION OF ABANDONED
PERSONAL PROPERTY ON COUNTY OF YORK REAL PROPERTY**

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED, by the Board of Commissioners of the County of York, Pennsylvania the following Ordinance:

1. Any and all personal property left on County of York real estate and remaining unclaimed for a period of time in excess of thirty (30) days shall be considered abandoned.

2. All personal property left on County of York property shall be stored under the direction of the Director of Facilities for the County of York or his/her designee.

3. In the event the personal property is not claimed within thirty (30) days, the Director of Facilities or his/her designees shall determine if the item of personal property's value is in excess of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars. If the determined value is in excess of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, the Director of Facilities or his/her designee shall attempt to sell the item in a commercially reasonable manner permitted by Pennsylvania law. If the item cannot be sold in a commercially reasonable manner or if the Director of Facilities or his/her designee determines that the item is worth less than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, the Director of Facilities or his designee may dispose of the item or donate it to a 501C3 charity.


4. To the extent a County of York department including, but not limited to, the York County Prison and Pleasant Acres Nursing and Rehabilitation Center, is required to dispose of abandoned personal property in a manner to conform with federal or state regulations, said regulations shall have precedence over this Ordinance.

5. The ordinance shall take effect immediately.




