

**COUNTY OF YORK, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA  
ORDINANCE NO. 1996-04**

**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING SIGNATORY AUTHORITY FOR ALL  
PERSONNEL ACTIONS INVOLVING EMPLOYEES OF THE  
COUNTY OF YORK WHO ARE UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF  
THE YORK COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND THE CIVIL SERVICE ACT  
AND UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE PENNSYLVANIA  
STATE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION AND REQUIRING NOTICE  
OF PERSONNEL ACTION INVOLVING OTHER COUNTY EMPLOYEES**

**BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:**

**ARTICLE I**

Delegation of signatory authority is hereby vested in Patrick B. McFadden, Director of Human Resources, and in any successor who is duly appointed Director of Human Resources for York County, Pennsylvania.

**ARTICLE II**

This Ordinance confirms the prior delegation of signatory authority informally to Patrick B. McFadden.

**ARTICLE III**

All personnel actions involving employees covered by Civil Service Regulations which deal with the termination of an employee and any issue appealable to the State Civil Service Commission, shall be brought to the attention of the County Commissioners at or near the time that such action is taken by the Director of Human Resources.

**ARTICLE IV**

All personnel action that involves the termination of any other County employee shall likewise be brought to the attention of the County Commissioners at or near the time that such action is taken by the Director of Human Resources.

**ARTICLE V**

All delegations of signatory authority heretofore granted are by this Ordinance rescinded.


ARTICLE VI
