ORDINANCE 2001-05

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AN APPROPRIATION OF
\$10,000 TO THE UNITED WAY SEPTEMBER 11 FUND FOR
FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT EMERGENCY
OPERATIONS IN PENNSYLVANIA, VIRGINIA, AND NEW
YORK

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED, by the Board of Commissioners
of the County of York, Pennsylvania, the following Ordinance:


1. The United States was attacked by terrorists on Tuesday, September 11, 2001 and federal, state, and local governments were called upon to provide unprecedented emergency services; and
2. The County of York is a third class county of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (the "County") and is governed by its Board of Commissioners; and
3. The County has the ability under the authority of 53 Pa.C.S.A. Section 2301 et seq. to jointly cooperate with the federal, state, and other local governments in the exercise of any function, power, or responsibility; and
4. The County has the authority under state law to appropriate funds for communications, emergency management organizations, firefighting departments and companies, fireman's association, health, hospitals, medical care and treatment, National Guard, and police functions and responsibilities.
5. The County appropriates \$10,000.00 to the United Way September 11 Fund to be used for federal, state, and local government emergency operations.
6. The County has determined that it is not appropriate or required that a joint agreement be entered into to carry-out the provisions of the County Code and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act.
7. Any and all actions undertaken prior to the adoption of this Ordinance are hereby ratified and approved.


